

Call for Papers for the International Anthology “Enabling Innovation“

„Enabling Innovation“ is an interdisciplinary and international anthology on innovative ability. Mixed author teams will provide a heterogeneous overview on current states of research, future trends and own practical experiences.

Key Questions for the Contents of the Articles

- How is your topic connected to the idea of innovative ability?
- How is your topic connected to the particular thematic main chapter?
- What is the state of research on this topic in your country? What are your practical experiences on this topic?
- Where do you see future research demands?
- What are your ideas and visions for Germany as a location for business?

Structure of the Article

1. Introduction
2. Main part
 - 2.x Subchapter (1. Level)
 - 2.x.x Subchapter (2. Level – not more than 2 sublevels)
3. Summary
4. Future Research Demands
5. What should be changed... Ideas and Visions for Germany as a Location for Business
6. Bibliography

Thematic Main Chapters

The anthology is structured into four thematic main chapters. All contributions must be related to one of these main chapters:

- 1 Working and Learning Environments – An Innovative Challenge
- 2 Management of Uncertainty – Key to Innovation
- 3 Innovative Ability and Change of Work
- 4 Intellectual Capital – Human Potential as Innovative and Competitive Advantage

Formatting Specifications for the Articles

- Side margins: Top 4 cm, bottom 2,5 cm, left 2 cm, right 5 cm
- Font: Times New Roman, size 12
- Line spacing: 1,5; hyphenless justification
- Accentuations: Bold – no cursive accentuations
- Captions: Size 12 bold
- Literature index: At the end of the article
- Citations: American, “Harvard-System”

Please use the attached template for your article.

Images and Tables

- Serial numbering in integers, bold font
- Short description below image/table, not in bold font
- Indication of Source after description
- The author is responsible for observing copyright. The IMO project will not be liable for possible copyright violations
- Do not embed pictures and other images into the text. Mark the according position of the image within the text and send the image separately in .jpg format with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi

Number of Pages

- 10 – 15 pages

Scope of supply and file formats

- Article (.doc or .rtf)
- Images (.jpg) separately with a minimum resolution of 300 dpi
- Short biography

Procedure

- Collection of authors and relevant topics oriented at the four main chapters
- Constitution of mixed author teams consisting of a national and an int. expert
- Composition of an article by a national/international expert of the author team
- Commentation on the article by the international/national teammate
- Combination of article and comment to a subchapter

- Until February, 2010: Submission of suggestions / Selection of topics and authors
- Until May, 2010: Delivery of articles
- Until September, 2010: Completion of comments on the articles
- September 30. through: International conference on the topic of
October 01., 2010 innovative ability in Potsdam
- Spring 2011: Publication of miscellany
